With just over a month before first service, the fifth Las Vegas restaurant for superstar chef Gordon Ramsay is now taking reservations at Caesars Palace.

Taking over the shuttered footprint of <u>Serendipity 3</u>, Gordon Ramsay Hell's Kitchen has completely gutted the structure and is still constructing the approximately 8,000- square-foot, no expense spared concept, right on Las Vegas Boulevard.

Featuring Strip-facing patio seating and room for nearly 300 guests, reservations are now being <u>accepted for a Jan. 16 debut</u>, ahead of a Jan. 26 grand opening.

Serving brunch, lunch and dinner, much of the menu will be inspired by dishes created on the namesake TV show, including "pan-seared scallops, lobster butternut squash risotto, truffle carbonara and crispy skin salmon."

New renderings released by the resort suggest despite the impending deadline, a great deal of work is still to be
